Greater Kansas City LISC supports redevelopment in more than 100 square miles of Kansas City metro area neighborhoods and helps transform them into healthy, sustainable communities in partnership with their residents.

Since 1981, Greater Kansas City LISC has invested more than \$132 million into urban-core neighborhoods on both sides of the state line, which has leveraged \$608 million in total development. This investment has created 942,435 square feet of community facilities and sports fields; 5,858 new and rehabbed homes and apartments; 5,303 minor home repairs; and over 1.4 million square feet of retail and commercial space.
